I am concerned about the spread of Invasive Weeds. For instance, Montrose CO. Road and Bridge spent \$100,000.00 last summer (2016) to improve the Transfer Road which provides access to USFS and BLM lands west of Montrose. The road base used contained sunflower seeds. The plants have sprung up along the roadside for the first time ever. I have called twice to Montrose Road and Bridge to advise them that sunflowers are not native in this area---they have never grown along side the Transfer road in the past.
