As you know, on September 11, 2014, officials from the Cibola National Forest and Grasslands (the Cibola) recently held a public meeting to discuss whether the US Forest Service (USFS) would recommend an area within the Mt. Taylor Ranger District for wilderness designation. While the community appreciated the opportunity to discuss this proposal, many believe that more face-to-face time with representatives from USFS is critical to determine the best way forward.

I will attend a public meeting on October 13, 2014 at 5:30 PM at the Knights of Columbus Hall (1601 East Roosevelt Ave) in Grants, NM to discuss this issue. I would like to personally invite you to listen to the concerns of local people about the potential for a wilderness proposal within the Cibola.
