I am writing as a contracted sole proprietor, to express support for Arizona Minerals, Inc. ("AMI") and its proposed exploratory drilling project in Santa Cruz County, Arizona, in the Coronado National Forest. The project is a valuable enhancement to the local community and Arizona's economy.

AMI's exploratory drilling project allows AMI to assess the value of its mineral rights and contribute to Arizona's economy while protecting and preserving the local environment. AMI currently employs about 160 people (either directly or through contracting work), and the proposed exploratory drilling project will increase that work force by another 25-30 contracted workers. AMI's Operation and Maintenance Plan is designed to have the smallest possible impact on the environment by minimizing the number of drill pads and maximizing the use of previously disturbed areas. This project is an example of AMI's strong focus on environmental responsibility. AMI goes above and beyond the legal mandates, utilizing best practices to ensure projects have the least environmental impact possible and to ensure the safety of workers, contractors and the community. AMI does it right, and I am proud to be working for them.

AMI is strongly committed to the local community in Santa Cruz County through active support of many local organizations. As a contractor on the project, I have seen AMI's dedicated support of both the Town of Patagonia, as well as Patagonia's Volunteer Fire Department, through clean-up events and community cookouts that directly contribute to the Fire Department's funding.
