The Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation (RMEF) appreciates the opportunity to comment on the proposed Stibnite Gold project on the Krassel Ranger District of the Payette National Forest and the Cascade Ranger District of the Boise National Forest.

This remote area of west central Idaho provides important wildlife habitat for elk, deer, moose, and wolves. The area creeks that flow into the East Fork South Fork Salmon River provide rich spawning grounds for Chinook salmon, as well as habitat for bull trout, westslope cutthroat trout, and rainbow trout. Given the critical role this land and water fulfills for wildlife, it is vital that the Payette National Forest's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) provide a thorough evaluation and disclosure of potential environmental effects of the proposed mining operation.
