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grass and preventing erosion; and that in the late 90's you can not measure grass usage by using stubble height as a Measure of Forage Utilization it was to manipulate the outcome. This happened on Black Mesa almost when the USFS clipped & weighed grass inside cages & primitives clipped the outside, the measurements came up with better on the outside than on the inside after it had been grazed. That is why we moved on to our current ways of growth season & usage & regrowth.

So I ask why would we go back to measurements when they didn't work instead of continuing on with what does work. As far as the rates at which they are charging that is something funny to me, just try walking 200 feet into a wooded area without having to cross a half dozen down logs, why raise rates on cows when you could sell logs that would increase jobs, boost our local economy, improve the health of our forest & lower the fire ~~danger~~ danger - now that's a thought. I would call that a WIN WIN!!
