We are both retired educators and long-time residents of Elko County, my wife and her family have hiked, hunted, collected firewood, and enjoyed the outdoor experience that the Ruby Mountains provide for over 60 years. I came to Elko county in 1980 and since then have become a part of her family and the community. Together we have raised our boys to enjoy these same activities. Now we have had the opportunity to introduce the natural history of the Ruby Mountains to our grandchildren.

Both Lois and I have conducted several field studies and have taken college students into the Ruby Mountains over the past 32 years involving the study of wildflowers, butterflies, breeding birds, amphibians, and land snails. In the case of land snails, I have published a peer review paper concerning the species and habitat affinities of these little-known invertebrates found in the East Humboldt and Ruby Mountains.

The damage that would be caused by gas and oil development would be significant on these groups of plants and animals. Besides the obvious pads for the placement of such wells, the increase in roads would inhibit the natural movement of animals, there would be an increase in the invasive weeds in these disturbed sites, erosion resulting from these activities would pollute creeks and springs with silt, and the dust and noise from such activities would interfere with breeding by native birds and mammals. This is to say nothing of the impacts it would have on folks who want to get into the mountains and enjoy our public lands.

We hope that you will consider these thoughts and pass them on to the people responsible for such decisions. Thank you for your time and consideration.
