Dear Mr. Fitzwilliams:

I am writing to express support for the Beaver Creek Resort – McCoy Park Terrain Development. As a Summit County resident, I have reviewed the facts about the project and it appears to be a solid approach to grow the resort, while also being an environmentally responsible approach to developing the terrain.

From an environmental standpoint, the proposed winter-only improvements for McCoy Park will be designed to avoid impacts to key wildlife species, including elk. There will not be summer activity in the area and existing elk calving closures will be maintained. Vegetation clearing would be limited to less than 30 acres that will be mitigated by a 1:1 tree restoration project. The lift alignments will avoid wetlands.

Beaver Creek Resort is renowned for world-class on- and off-mountain offerings with a strong focus on families. A protected family ski zone at McCoy Park is an important experience to create and new trails for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing also will be available and separate from the downhill skiing terrain.
