I have been cross country and backcountry skiing for over 40 years, and I <u>object to the Preferred alternative #5</u> you are proposing for Subpart C, Winter Travel Management. The following areas are protected, and should be designated non-motorized in winter because they are accessible, have varied terrain, and meet the needs of the human-powered winter recreation community. Those areas are:

- Mattley Ridge
- Cabbage Patch to Black Spring
- Osborne Hill and Lake Alpine
- Big Meadow
- Herring Creek Road

Since the FS has not followed protocol to protect these areas, and all near-natural areas in the Stanislaus NF, is no reason to now allow motorized use.

- 1. Please designate the following as non-motorized in winter:
 - Mattley Ridge
 - Cabbage Patch to Black Spring
 - Osborne Hill and Lake Alpine
 - Big Meadow
 - · Herring Creek Road
- 2. Please designate all near-natural areas as non-motorized in winter
- 3. Adopt Alternative 3
- 4. Minimize conflicts between user groups by designating these area noted above, and all Near Natural areas as non-motorized in winter.
- 5. Do not reduce the current size of the Near Natural areas because these are set aside for the public to enjoy in an undisturbed setting.
- 6. Do not reward the behavior of users that break the law and break the rules. This means, do not reward snowmobile trespassers by allowing uses in areas that are Near Natural.
