any proposal needs to account for the unfortunately likely event that Midas, like its many predecessors, defaults on its obligations to permanently and completely restore the site. Please do not leave us with yet another permanent pollution site where we once had a functioning ecosystem

- the public should not subsidize Midas's activities, including its clean-up.
