

The most helpful scoping comments are those that focus on resource issues and identify information such as: 1) specific resource concerns; 2) data that should be included in the analysis; 3) project design elements that meet the purpose and need statement and should be considered in the range of alternatives; and 4) best management practices, standard operating procedures, or mitigation that would help reduce impacts.

I am totally against the Midas Gold proposed mining activity in the Stibnite area. This activity will be devastating to the entire area - environmentally, traffic-wise, socially and noise-wise. Allowing the massive amount of traffic (130+ daily trips) and environmental disruption will totally destroy the calm and peaceful Warm Lake area which the Forest Service has long protected. If this project is approved, please require Midas Gold to provide turnouts and passing lanes on the Warm Lake Highway & to maintain the roadway which will deteriorate from excessive traffic. I feel that 130+ daily trips per day (many more if the weather prohibits winter work and construction/work time is concentrated from May to November) is excessive. I ask that the Forest Service to require Midas Gold reduce the number of daily trips & curtail the number of hours proposed. Because of the size of Warm Lake, there is a
