I would like to begin by stating that I appreciate the economic value of the upcoming Midas Gold open pit mining project. I think it is great that Midas Gold would be required to remediate previous mining activities and environmental damage to the area, but the amount of potential environmental damage that could occur with an open pit mining project is, quite frankly, deeply upsetting.
