The Stibnite Gold project presented by Midas Gold has many potential benefits for Idaho and the local area. These benefits range from economic, to environmental. I strongly urge your thorough considerations of the project. Some of the points that I would ask that you pay extra attention to are:

The remediation of historical mining damage. Much of this area was historically mined. This mining occurred in times when environmental considerations where simply not thought of, and in times of great need and haste (WWII). This project as presented is possibly the only chance to address these issues with the hopes of abating a large portion of them.

One of the great issues we are currently facing in our efforts to restore Idaho, is fish habitat. The remediation of this area will improve down stream fish habitat by stopping the continual input of pollution (mine drainage, and sediment input), and improve upstream habitat by installing a fish passable migration rout. This would be the first time fish would be able to swim up stream since the 30's.

Aside from the multiple environmental benefits of this project (I only mention a few), there are large economic benefits as well.
