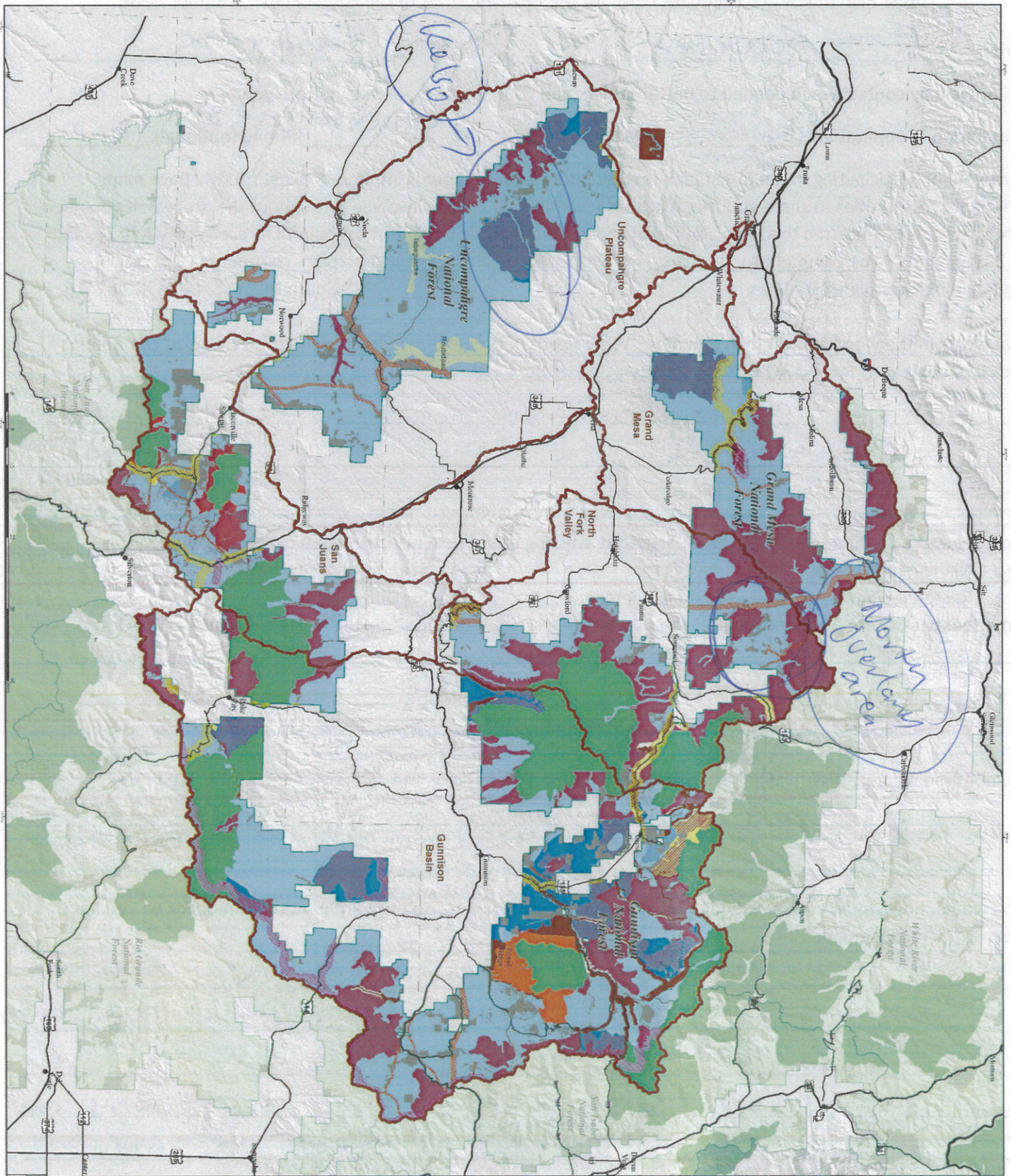
If you would, how would you re-categorize the area you're referring to, and why? What other feedback do you have about future management there?
