The Ashley National Forest has released, in the Federal Register, a Notice of Intent to revise the Ashley National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan and prepare an Environmental Impact Statement. The Forest officially begins the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) phase of the revision of its 1986 Land Management Plan for the Ashley National Forest by soliciting comments and input on four documents:

- Preliminary Need to Change the Ashley National Forest Land Management Plan
- Proposal to Revise the Land Management Plan for the Ashley National Forest (also known as the draft forest plan)
- Ashley National Forest Evaluation of Potential Wilderness Inventory Areas
- Wild and Scenic Rivers Eligibility Study and Report

These documents were developed by the forest plan revision team, based on the July 2017 Assessment. We also received helpful inputs and analysis from tribal, federal, state and local governments, as well as the general public.
