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I'm also concerned about impacts on wildlife, water, and wilderness. The drilling would involve clearing trees to create roads and drill pads, possibly during avian breeding season in July. It would require crossing Homestake Creek and siphoning water from it. The seismic survey would be conducted by sending repeated sound bursts at 170 decibels — as loud as a shotgun blast — in a narrow part of Homestake Valley. The drilling and these sound bursts would be easily heard, for weeks, in the Holy Cross Wilderness. Part of the seismic survey would also take place in a designated Roadless Area.

This proposed action is damaging: it will have significant impacts on resources, from fens to wilderness, that are protected under Forest Service regulations and federal law. I ask that you begin a public process to map fens in the project area, and that you conduct an Environmental Assessment to more fully consider the impacts of the geotechnical investigation on wetlands, wilderness, and Roadless Areas in Homestake Valley.
