I have worked for Midas Gold at Stibnite for nearly nine years. I am proud to work for a company that is so committed to safety and environmental stewardship. Midas gold has put together a project with a great economic resource and plan to restore an area that needs repair.

Midas Gold has been working on the Stibnite Gold Project for over ten years collecting scientific data and information to create the best project possible. The Draft Environmental Impact Statement Alternative 2 is the alternative that will create the best project possible.

Alternative 2 places the tailings storage facility (TFS) within the Meadow Cr. valley. The Meadow Cr. valley has extensive disturbance from previous mining. By Placing the new TFS in this valley Midas will have the opportunity to clean up legacy tailings that currently degrade water quality and keep from disturbing more previously undisturbed land.

Alternative 2 also outlines a new access route to the project that will be vital to keep safe access to the project. The proposed route primarily stays on ridge tops, which will help to keep traffic away from waterways and falling or sliding debris that could land on the road.
