The Stibnite Gold Project proposed by Midas Gold Idaho will help give communities across Valley County and throughout Central Idaho a much-needed economic boost while fixing some of the longstanding environmental issues that have been caused by past mining projects that did not follow the same level of regulations and standards that are in place today. That is why I am urging the U.S. Forest Service to move forward with Alternative 2 as preferred by Midas and assessed in the Draft Environmental Impact Study (DEIS).

Especially with today's economic climate, more jobs are always welcome, and the Stibnite Gold Project will provide them aplenty. During the construction phase, the project will employ 600-700 jobs directly and another 500-800 jobs indirectly, paying out tens of millions of dollars in annual payroll. Once complete, ongoing operations of the mine will support another 500-600 direct jobs and 450-600 indirectly, including workers in the local supply chain, transportation, and hospitality, etc.
