I write to you today to urge you to accept Alternative 2 proposed by Midas Gold Idaho in their modified Plan of Restoration and Operations for the Stibnite Gold Project. As a resident of Idaho and a concerned citizen, I believe their plan is comprehensive and benefits our region both environmentally and economically.

Our nation's economy has been severely impacted by the public health crisis we have endured over the past several months, so it's encouraging to learn about the economic investment that Midas Gold will bring with the Stibnite Gold Project. These opportunities are more rare than we know. The Stibnite Gold Project promises to create hundreds of jobs for the areas residents and bring critical tax dollars to rural Idaho communities. The public funds that Midas is estimated to generate is more than \$18 million per year during construction, more than \$18 million per year during reclamation.

Not only will Midas Gold provide our counties with good jobs, livable wages, and substantial tax revenue, the company has also proven to be a wonderful community partner. In 2018 alone, Midas Gold invested \$330,000 in road maintenance activities to improve infrastructure conditions and keep Idahoans safe. Through November 2019, Midas Gold spent nearly \$100,000 on community giving and education outreach and employees volunteered another thousands of hours of their time in our community.
