I appreciate the opportunity to comment on the Stibnite Gold Project as it will directly impact me and my access to the backcountry.

My wife and I had the opportunity tour the Midas site, learn of its history, the contamination issues and the company's plans to mitigate those issues to pt prevent offsite environmental damage through onsite treatment and containment. It appeared to us that Midas was working closely with federal and state agencies and responding positively to those agencies concerns and recommendations. Their financial investment required before the fist dollar of production profit can be realized is staggering. The final plan that includes monumental habitat restoration will, over time, will be a tremendous improvement to the barren waste site that exists today. The economic impact of jobs and services will have very positive effect on the local area and the rest of the state as well.

As the U.S. Forest Service and other state and federal agencies review the proposed plan and determine the course of action, I encourage you to consider and appropriately weigh the positive benefits Midas Gold will have on Idaho.
