GREETINGS,

If Midas Gold Idaho is allowed to move forward with the Stibnite Gold Project, they will reclaim an area impacted by historical mining, create hundreds of well-paying jobs and provide a huge boost to our economy in the process. It is a win-win for Valley County. We need to permit the project.

Midas Gold has developed a plan to provide our nation with a domestic supply of antimony and protect the environment in the process. Today, the company is already help keep sediment out of the waterways and air by applying dust abatement materials to Johnson Creek Road. Midas Gold is mindful of its impact on the environment and the project is not anticipated to cause or contribute to an exceedance of air quality standards. In fact, I believe the project will have a net positive benefit on the environment. Under Alternative 2, the company will reconnect salmon to their native spawning grounds for the first time in 80 years, remove sediment from the waterways near site and safely store old mine material that is currently polluting groundwater.
