The sooner, the better for Idaho workers and our entire economy. Let's get the show on the road and approve alternative 2 without any more delays.

This company seems to know a thing or two about hiring locally whenever possible. Midas Gold has been in the area for a decade now and in that time, it has already spent nearly \$70 million with Idaho contractors, suppliers, and other businesses. That's pretty impressive if you ask me. Just think of the investments we'll see once the project gets off the ground.
