(Coeur).
	The FTFAF is dedicated to preserving Alaska's economic viability and future through education. FTFAF works to educate the public by monitoring and researching natural resources management issues and highlighting reasonable use, access, economic opportunity, and development. All of which can be done while protecting the environment.
John Sandor Director Emeritus	Our specific comments on the DSEIS are as follows:
Don Habeger Executive Director	<i>Economics – Employment</i> Kensington Mine provides over 350 year-round, high paying jobs making Coeur one of the most significant employers in Juneau. Suppose the USFS selects the No Action Alternative. In that case, many workers and their families are likely to leave the Juneau area to find comparable and/or remain in Juneau and secure lower-wage employment, which would devastate the Juneau economy. We encourage the USFS to approve the Proposed Action (POA 1) and help keep stable and high paying jobs in Juneau.
	<i>No Significant Impacts</i> During the USFS's scoping effort for POA 1, several significant issues were identified. However, after taking the affected environment and environmental consequences into account, we note and support that the DSEIS finds that POA 1 will

result in no significant impacts (direct or indirect). As such, the USFS should not delay publishing an FSEIS and reaching a Record of Decision approving POA 1.

To Close

We strongly encourage the USFS to swiftly finalize the SEIS and reach a Record of Decision that approves the Proposed Action. Acting in this matter is supported by the Draft SEIS's analysis of the Proposed Action, which clearly demonstrates that Coeur's Life of Mine Extension will not have significant adverse effects on the human environment. Furthermore, the Draft SEIS analysis also indicates that POA 1 is consistent with the Tongass National Forest's Forest Plan. For these reasons, POA 1 should be approved by the USFS.
