



These stakeholders are ready and willing to support collaborative efforts, or otherwise proceed with litigation to effectuate a change in the Ochoco Forest's position regarding criminal prosecution. To this end, we request a meeting to discuss the Ochoco Forest permitting a limited group of individuals to provide supplemental feed to horses facing starvation without fear of criminal prosecution.
