I've been following the Salt River wild horses for the last few years and have learned that the removal of wild horses is detrimental in economic, environmental ways. Economically the tourist industry that depends upon the draw of seeing the wild horses will be negatively impacted, and at a time when COVID has already done damage. In addition the money that would be needed to board and care for the horses would be far more than what would be needed to manage them in the wild.
