Dear Mr. Osher:

Thank you for your letter of July 16, 2021, on behalf of your partner organizations, concerning drought conditions in the Western United States. I apologize for the delayed response.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Forest Service agrees the abnormally dry to extreme drought conditions are a concern, and we will continue monitoring its effect on the multiple uses that take place on National Forest System lands.

Forest Service Line Officers and Rangeland Specialists at all levels are working with grazing permittees to make administrative changes to the permitted grazing season where these conditions exist. Furthermore, we are focused on long-term management of the grazing resource at national, regional, and local levels. Thank you for the specific examples you provided; we will look into those situations.

We believe we have the necessary authority, rules, and regulations in place to be responsive to the current drought and climate change. Many of the changes you seek are best addressed during renewal of the land management plans that provide comprehensive guidance for resource management on all National Forests and Grasslands.
