Kristine Salzmann,

I am aware that you are working on a Travel Management Plan.

I would like you to know that I consider roads 352 and 326 extremely important to my recreational access points. As a climber, I deeply understand that the climbing community uses these roads to frequent their natural playgrounds. I have spoken with an angler who uses those roads to access a favorite fishing spot. I'm pretty sure that hunters use this road as well. These roads are particularly important for access to climbing spots in the springtime and fall. I know that these important climbing areas draw climbers from foreign lands to visit Lander.

I understand that these roads are considered level 2 roads, however, I do not believe them to be up to that level in actuality. The prioritization of these roads to get them up to level 2

should be considered important in the USFS's Travel Management Plan.
