destruction of forest serenity

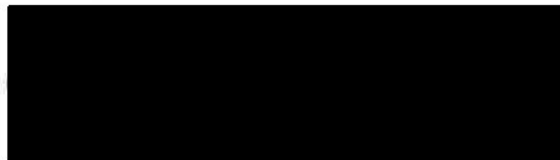
specific to the planed travel management Northern unit:

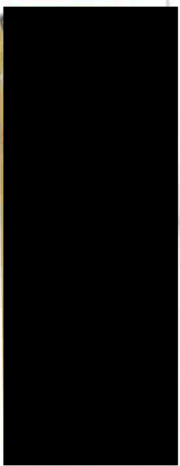
AZ-A proposes to extend a ATV trail through an elk calving and wintering area also used by grizzlies. This area has a maze of illegal ATV trails. Granting a new atv trail here validates the violation of law. Not a good management practice and not recommended.

The creation of loop trails promotes a race tract situation and doses not seam to fit a forest environments. Use of existing forest roads is sufficient. Road 123.1b needs a repair of a washout at line creek to complete a loop and connect to road 123.

Enforcement of ATV's is a serious problem. I suggest larger more visible license plates would help this problem and make reporting violations easier. A heavy penalty for violation of rules will also help achieve compliance of ATV users.

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
