To Whom it May Concern,

In travelling on federal lands we have noticed none of the signs or trails are consistently marked. I would be nice to know what the designation is or the route/trail number we are on. Sometimes there is a sign, but it is not maintained, so it is illegible. Most signs do not say what type of travel is permitted (motorized, horse, foot etc.)

As for the trails proposals, on paper it sounds pretty fair. Most of the closures look reasonable and the new or upgraded trails will improve travel and help protect our lands.

The problem will be when a trail is closed and the 1%ers go there anyway, because "they always have and no one is going to tell them where they can and can not go". Enforcement will be difficult because these rule breakers simply don't care and usually don't get caught, or if they do get caught it is only a slap on the wrist and "no, no , don't do that, bad."
