Hello Sue & Andy,

In looking at the proposed seasonal road closure change for Elk Fork I see a potential conflict. The proposal calls for the gate open date to be 6/16. My permit start date is 6/1 and my trailhead is behind the gate. Although I don't always utilize it that early there are times when I do and with the amount of public and guided trail riding that occurs there, utilizing the public trailhead/parking could be problematic. The solution could be moving the gate or providing me with a key or combo on a case by case basis.
