It's my understanding that the USFS is working on a travel management plan concerning backcountry roads. I wanted to bring two to your attention, road 326 and road 352. My wife and I travel regularly to the Lander area to rock climb and those two roads in particular are vital to us for access to the amazing climbing in the Little Popo Agie Canyon. Climbers as well as fishermen, horn hunters, hikers, etc all use these roads. It is also my understanding that these roads are currently considered level 2 in the current report but I can assure you that they have not been maintained as level 2 and are in lesser condition. I would encourage you to prioritize them both so increased maintenance levels make access easier to the recreation opportunities we all love. Thank you very much for your time and consideration.
