

**FOREST PLAN, SHOSHONE NATIONAL FOREST**

**ADDITIONAL ROADS:**

We agree strongly with the Wyoming majority who oppose any additional roads in the Shoshone National Forest.

In our judgment roads adversely affect wildlife and the habitat necessary for their survival. Vehicle travel creates unsightly ruts, especially when the road is wet, and often bypass damaged areas by driving on adjoining lands, thereby creating additional damage.

The discussion on roads prompts questions about costs to taxpayers for road maintenance, cleanup from littering which always occurs, signs, etc.

There is an old saying "*DON'T FIX IT IF IT AIN'T BROKE.*" *There are presently enough roads in the forest and there is no logical reason to carve up the forest any more than it already is.*
