I do not support this alternative. The proposed route has steep terrain and boggy areas that would lead to increased soil runoff and scarring of the terrain. This area is used by elk for migration to and from forest land and private land. This is also an elk and moose calving area. Grizzly bears frequent this area in spring and fall. Foot and horseback traffic use this area and both trails are maintained by back country horsemen. Potential illegal motorized use could cause some real damage to this area.
