



It has come to our attention that the proposed North Fork Crooked River Forest Resilience Project will effect roads and access to forest land that our membership base uses. We are writing this letter in opposition of closing some of the roads listed under this proposed project. Multiple members of our organization recreate in this area and utilize the assets that are to be closed under this project. The roads we are referring to are 4260-200, 4260-300, 4260-650, 4260-750 and 4230-600. These roads are utilized by many different user groups for multiple activities and are already closed during big game hunting season green dot road closure to minimize impact during that time. The 4260-300 and 4260-200 are green dot roads and at one time were determined to be important enough to be left open even during big game hunting season. These two roads provide access to large sections of BLM and Forest Service land that will be inaccessible by many of the individuals that utilize them now if they are closed. Please re-consider the scope of your road closures in this project.
