The Uwharrie Ranger District of the National Forests in North Carolina has prepared a draft environmental assessment (EA) to determine management options to ensure continued safe and reliable access for five miles of interconnected National Forest System roads (NFSR) - NFSRs 576 (Moccasin Creek Road), 553 (Dutch John Road), and 6584 (Green Gap Road) - located in Montgomery County, North Carolina.

The draft EA is available for review on the project webpage:
<https://www.fs.usda.gov/project/?project=59699>. The proposed project is an activity implementing a land management plan and is subject to pre-decisional objection process at 36 CFR 218 Subparts A and B.

We welcome your involvement and encourage your review of and comments on this analysis. Comments may be submitted through the project comment page located link below, additional information on providing comments is provided in the attached letter:

Electronic comments may be uploaded as Microsoft Word documents (.doc or .docx), portable document files (.pdf), rich text format (.rtf), text (.txt), or hypertext markup

language (.html) files. Only those who submit timely and specific comments during one of the comment periods will be eligible to object. In order to file an objection, each individual or representative from each organization submitting comments must either sign the comments or verify identity upon request. Any individual or entity that provided timely, substantive, specific written comments during this scoping period or during the 30-day notice and comment period will meet the eligibility to object.

Comments must be submitted by 30-days from the date of the legal notice published in the Montgomery Herald. This notice is anticipated to publish on August 24, 2022. The first day of this comment period is counted the day after the legal notice is published. Only those who submit timely and specific comments during one of the comment periods will be eligible to object. In order to file an objection, each individual or representative from each organization submitting comments must either sign the comments or verify identity upon request. Any individual or entity that provided timely, substantive, specific written comments during the scoping period held in 2021 or during this 30-day notice and comment period will meet the eligibility to object.
