I was born and raised in McCall Idaho just a few miles from the proposed mining site. Prior to (Midas) now Perpetua there has not been one agency or organization that has offered to clean up the mine site from the mining done in WWII and beyond.

Everything Perpetua has done in the community has been incredible and I am sure they will take take care of the mine site better than any other group that might complain about mining now.

If the other organizations that are complaining were so concerned especially the Nez Pierce Tribe why have they not spent one dime to clean up the site, they can only complain.

The Stibnite Gold Project offers the best opportunity to have an incredible company restore the mine site and provide the critical minerals needed for our country.
