
Ms. Linda Jackson,

I encourage you to permit the improvements proposed by the company and move the project forward using the Burntlog Road route.

One of the top reasons why I support Perpetua Resources' plans is because it will secure an American source of antimony. The federal government deemed antimony a critical mineral because of its use in the energy and national defense industries. Today, there is no domestic source of this mineral. Antimony comes from China or Russia, which makes the U.S. at risk. America's military depend on antimony to protect our country and stay safe. The mineral is used in munitions, military clothing, night vision goggles, infrared sensors and so much more. It is irresponsible to continue relying on our adversaries to provide us with antimony. I have reviewed the plan and believe the Burntlog option will allow the company to mine safely, minimize the impacts to the environment and help protect our national security, it will also keep the mine traffic off Johnson Creek and leave that to the recreationalist and Yellow Pine community members after construction is completed.

I encourage the USFS to move the Stibnite Gold Project forward and permit Perpetua Resources' project as outlined in the 2021 Modified Mine Plan.
