Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Stibnite Gold Project as part of the public permitting process. I know this project will have a positive impact on the environment, communities surrounding the site, and Idahoans.

This is the chance to build a stronger and greater America!

America needs antimony and gold. We need to strengthen our supply chains and bring mining home. I know people are concerned about mining's impacts on the environment but regulators identified Perpetua Resources' refined plan as its preferred alternative because they determined the company could mine while minimizing impacts on the environment and communities. One of the ways the company does that is by using Burntlog Road. This reduces the number of stream crossings for mine traffic compared to the Johnson Creek Route, reduces the chances of accidents with recreationists, and minimizes the impacts of potential spills. Keeping traffic away from river crossings also lowers sedimentation impacts from mining.

I encourage the USFS to move the Stibnite Gold Project forward and permit the Perpetua Resources project as outlined in the 2021 Modified Mine Plan. At this point, the Stibnite Gold Project has been studied by regulators for the last six years. That is enough. Now, it is time to let Perpetua get to work.
