The Lemon Gulch Trail Project #58831: Mountain Bike Trail Complex/Park is a really bad idea! I vote for the "NO ACTION" alternative!

Please, I would like a Personal Response of my concerns from Mr. Turner & Mr. Jeffries!

- * The **COMPACTION & EROSION** caused by the offsite camping, biking on steep, talus trails & the construction of the trails isn't sustainable & will cause irrepairable damage to the drainage!
- * It's critical elk & deer habitat.
- * The increased usage will increase the probability of wildfire, since Crook County has been in a drought situation for many, many years!
- * No economic benefit.
- * Will fragment the Forest.
- * Complex will reduce the resilience of the Forest.
- * As of Jan. 1, 2023 there will be no logging on sloped ground of 70% & greater. Why would the USFS be allowed to build a Mountain Bike Trail/Complex when most of this terrain is 70% slope or better? They were allowed to log it over 40 years ago, but only by Helicopter.
- * The project should have a Environmental Impact Statement done because of so many negative impacts on the watershed & human environment.
