I am writing to express my views on Perpetua Resources' Stibnite Gold Project. The opportunity presented by the project is compelling for many reasons and I am committed to seeing this project come to fruition. This is the best opportunity to clean up legacy tailings and waste, reconnect fish to miles of spawning grounds that they have been blocked from for 80 years and restore a river all at the cost of a public mining company, I think this is a big win. Without Perpetua Resources, the site will likely never get the environmental attention it deserves. Valley County deserves better than that, let's get this site cleaned up at the cost of another mine, not the taxpayers.

Last summer, Perpetua agreed to provide antimony to largescale battery maker Ambri. I support the Johnson Creek access during construction, but support Burntlog route life of mine so that those of us that snowmobile can have northern access between Cabin/Trout Creek and Yellow Pine after construction.
