
Dear Ms. Jackson,

America desperately needs antimony. This mineral is used in munitions, large-capacity storage batteries, fire retardants and more. Currently, we are entirely dependent on foreign countries to provide this mineral, which is why I am writing in support of the Stibnite Gold Project. This project can stop our import reliance on antimony.

The permitting process has made the Stibnite Gold Project better. Perpetua Resources has listened to input from the public and regulators and found ways to reduce its project footprint, improve fish habitat and eliminate the need for long-term water treatment. Reviewing the Burntlog Road option in the SDEIS, it is clear to me the company plans to mine the area responsibly and minimize its environmental impacts. "Compared to the No Action Alternative, the 2021 MMP would remove additional legacy mining materials and further reduce their impacts on water quality but would also contribute new sources of mine waste material to the East Fork SFSR drainage. However, the new mine waste materials would be equipped with current technologies and design features (e.g., liner and cover systems) to reduce their impacts." (Water Quality Specialists Report;7.5.3, p. 187) I hope the USFS will move this improved plan forward.

This project is a huge opportunity for Idaho. After 6 years of intense review, I encourage the U.S. Forest Service to permit the 2021 Modified Mine Plan so this brownfield site can finally be restored.
