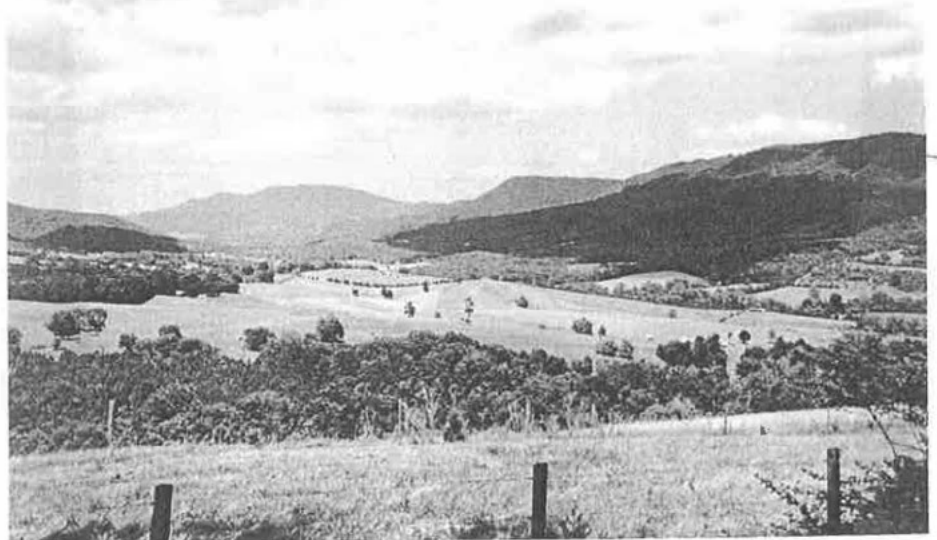
Concerning.....Mountain Valley Pipeline Comment

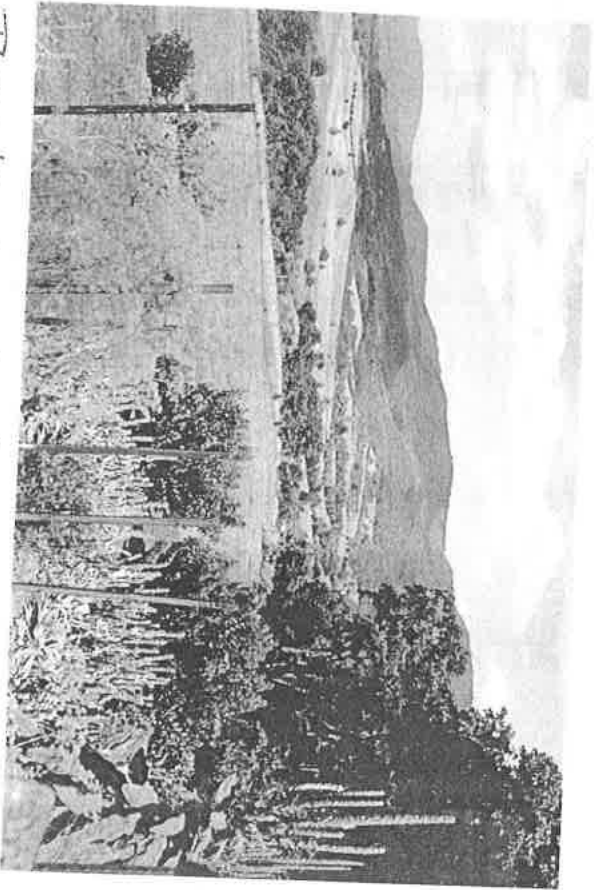
