I am requesting an idea of specific treatments for the National Forest property adjacent to my property.

I have the following concerns:

1. I have had problems with trespassers in vehicles circumventing the gate and driving thru private property (after about 50 yds the road enters private land) continuing on to forest property and on to my property. I believe that removing trees along the county road demarcation of the National Forest Property, especially near the gate, will only make it easier for off road vehicles to enter, and subsequently, enter my property. In addition, since I lease the road, I am responsible for any damages to the road and am required to make repairs. Because of this, it is imperative I express my concern here-- Otherwise I will be financially responsible for damages caused far outside of my control.

2. I would like to know what will happen with the road I lease during the Project. Will I have access to my property via the road I lease? Will I be refunded in a pro-rated manner if I do not have access? Will there be access roads and skid areas for the loggers that will later be used by trespassers to access forest property and subsequently, my property?

3. How long will the project take? Do you try to work with adjacent landowners and consider the noise and disruption to their schedule and quality of life—hunting seasons and family events and holidays, for instance?

4. I would like to see clear boundary marking—signage to make it clearer when the forest property ends.
