As a result, modern mining is nowhere near sustainable and our public lands are constantly being degraded by irresponsible mining operations. Until Congress passes mining law reform, we need to be extra diligent about making sure mining companies follow every rule and take every precaution to ensure the highest level of care for our natural resources. That means "no shortcuts!"
