<p>Comments:</p> <p>I don't see much point in winter maintenance of trails between Miner's Creek Road and Zach's Stop. This area is so heavily trafficed that by the time TOF could get out there to drag it after a storm, it would already be packed out by snowshoes.</p> <p>I do see the point of the proposed bike only trail near the Rainbow Lake Trail relieving some congestion. My concern is that adding another trail in there will add further confusion for visitors. I encounter too many people who are confused or "lost" in the web of trails there. If a new bike trail is added, it should be very close to the existing trail, more like a "bike lane".</p> <p>What would be most helpful in that area is more signage → point the way to 7th Avenue, Rainbow Lake, 2nd Avenue, Zach's Stop, etc. Perhaps a map at entry points? I know it's impossible to be truly "lost" back there, but I've encountered some pretty confused visitors,</p>
