The City of Glenwood Springs has been proud to support the protection of the Thompson Divide since 2009. As documented in the attached correspondence from the past decade-and-a-half of support, the Thompson Divide area is worthy of protection. We understand and appreciate that the Forest Service will be including the City's comments on the Federal Register Notice of the Withdrawal, attached hereto for convenience, as part of the Scoping Comment Period. With the recent election of three new City Council Members, we wish to reaffirm that the City fully supports Thompson Divide Withdrawal.

The City also wishes to request designation as a "cooperating agency" pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) regulations 40 C.F.R. § 1508.1.
