

Letter Text	I live in BC about 15 miles north of the US border on the Similkameen River, a tributary of the Okanagan River that flows into the Columbia. At one time it was a Chinook spawning stream until a dam was built south of the border northwest of Oroville WA to generate power during WW II. It is just sitting now blocking the salmon run. I know that Chinook will only spawn in cold water (high elevations) and when I read about Perpetua taking over the operations of the mine I was elated because I had already bought into the former operation of the mine site and was interested in what US authorities had already done by opened the Okanagan to salmon—but no chinooks. The Similkameen Dam has kept them from high cold spawning waters. Thanks to the opening of the mine by Perpetua we can hope that at lease some Chinooks will return and officials will look to one other river, the Similkameen by removing a useless dam that does no one any good.
