Leanne, Please let me introduce myself. My name's
Mark Klinke, I'm a retired Silviculture Forester off
the Nez Perce/Clearwater NF (1989-2014)

I'm writing to you to express my concerns over the
Final NP-CNF Forest Plan, specifically the removal of
32,000 acres from the Great Burn Area of recommended
Wilderness.

I was in charge of the Whitebark pine Restoration
Program on the Forest. I've spent a considerable amount
of time in some of the areas designated for removal.

It would be a complete shame to open this remote,
wonderful area up to snowmobiles + mountain bikes.

How much coordination + analysis was completed
between the Lolo NF + the NP-CNF in/on the Great Burn
Area? It seems that a co-managed area should be
analyzed together regardless of Forest boundaries.

How will the opening up of the Great Burn effect exposed
Whitebark pine seedling + saplings on exposed ridges?

What about the encroachment of non-native plants +
grasses into the area? How does the listing of the
Wolverine effect this remote area?

I urge you to sit down with Cheryl to discuss
these concerns and her rationalization for her
decision to open up a large portion of the Great Burn
to snowmobiles.
