None of your websites allow me to directly respond to this issue. So, I am hoping you will forward to whomever or whatever is needed to make a comment.

A a retired NASA environmental manager and an avid backpacker and wilderness explorer, I ask you to retain the wilderness character in Alaska intended by the Wilderness Act.

Cabins don't belong in designated Wilderness, period; in fact, I submit that they violate Federal Law. The U.S. Forest Service must leave its policy unchanged and phase out ANILCA cabins, as was the original intent. These cabins were never meant to persist in Wilderness, and to change this policy would undermine ANILCA and the Wilderness Act.

I have much experience with other Wilderness Areas where similar cabins exist. I ensure you that they are indeed intrusive and out-of-character with the wilderness experience. Please remove them. Thanks,
