RE: Davis Hazardous Fuels Reduction

Following are the Wyoming Department of Agriculture (WDA) comments regarding the U.S Forest Service-Bearlodge Ranger District (BRD), Davis Hazardous Fuels Reduction Project (Project).

Our comments are specific to our mission: dedication to the promotion and enhancement of Wyoming's agriculture, natural resources and quality of life. As the proposed project could affect our industry, citizens, and natural resources it is important that you continue to inform us of proposed actions and decisions and continue to provide the opportunity to communicate pertinent issues and concerns.

The proposed Project will commercially thin up to 627 acres in the 1,168-acres Project area. The BRD will retain trees with fire-resistant characteristics while improving stand health, increasing tree vigor and growth, and reducing the risk of stand-replacing wildfire. The WDA fully supports the proposed Project to use commercial thinning to reduce fuel loading and accomplish other vegetative objectives to improve conditions on the forest.

The WDA urges the BRD to consider the benefits of proper livestock grazing management for post-project recovery. There are situations when properly timed high intensity, short duration grazing may be beneficial. In order to meet vegetative objectives, the BRD should work with livestock grazing permittees to develop flexible opportunities for livestock grazing in the Project area and avoid relying on rest and deferment as a management tool. WDA opposes a mandatory 2-year rest, often used as part of agency vegetative treatments. Additionally, the WDA encourages BRD to utilize livestock grazing in such a manner to help reduce fine fuels on BRD as an added tool in fire management practices.
