Dear Ms. Duvall,

The State of Alaska (State) reviewed the False Bay Cabin Construction Project. The proposed project includes constructing a new road and marine accessible cabin, vehicle parking area, vault toilet outhouse, woodshed, and trail access to the beach. The project location is on Chichagof Island, approximately 25 miles from Hoonah on Forest Service Road 8530 adjacent to False Bay on Northern Chatham Strait. The below comments represent the consolidated views of the State resource agencies.

The State is supportive of public use cabin development in the Hoonah Ranger District and of this proposal to construct a new public use cabin and related infrastructure. The cabin will create increased access to hunting opportunities. Cabins and other hard sided shelters play an important role in enhancing public use and access to federal public lands in Alaska and can provide for the health and safety of people using public lands. Congress sought to protect access to public lands for harvest and recreation uses with the numerous cabin provisions in the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act (ANILCA).

The project website mentions a buoy that is not further described in the scoping proposal. Any buoy anchored in State of Alaska waters would need a permit from the Department of Natural Resources (DNR); please reach out to DNR for further assistance.

We request the following considerations when maintaining existing or constructing new cabins:

- Plans for cabins that are used for hunting or trapping should include a meat pole separated from the cabin for cabin occupant use.
- ANILCA allows the use of motorized equipment such as chainsaws on federal lands, which could be used to supply fuel for the woodstove. We suggest providing guidance for appropriate firewood harvest locations and techniques to protect resources while also supporting cabin users.


